3. Why didn't Grant wave back at the people who might have waved to him as he drove to Bayonne?
4. On page 69, name at least two prejudicial things mentioned
5. How is the term, "Quiet" interpreted by Miss Emma on the bottom of page 69, later to be corrected on the top of page 70?
6. Who is Paul? Add a brief description. What does Grant call him?
7. What was it that Miss Emma carried in the basket she brought? How do you know about these items?
8. How did Jefferson greet Miss Emma and Grant? (p.71)
9. Describe the cell (bottom paragraph of page 71) [Significance of a sycamore tree? ]
10. What did Jefferson finally say to Miss Emma at the top of page 73? Explain.
11. What question does Jefferson ask on page 73? What did his (Jefferson's) eyes ask as he looked at Grant?
12. What question does Jefferson ask on page 74 regarding who Grant is?
13. At the end of Chapter 9, what did Grant do regarding Miss Emma? Who encouraged him to do this?

1. How would you characterize the beginning description of Chapter 10, p.75 ?
2. How was the fourth visit to the jail different?
3. What did Tante Lou inform Grant about? (p.77)
4. "I had the feeling that Miss Emma was not nearly as sick as she pretended to be." Why does Grant think this?
5. Why wouldn't Tante Lou go with Grant to the jail? Why did Grant feel that "this had been planned from the beginning."?
6. Explain Grant's comment: "Everything you sent me to school for, you're stripping me of it" ... Explain what Grant means? (p.79)
7. What is Tante Lou's comment to Grant? (p. 79 – final paragraph of Ch. 10)
